Practical guidelines are provided on issues relating to the preachers personal devotion to his dedication to properly examining the text. A valuable section is devoted to explaining the steps of developing an expository sermon.
- Maier, Gerhardt. *Biblical Hermeneutics*. Crossway Books.
Among the most seminal scholars in Germany; he reflects an entire lifetime of evangelical scholarship. Maier demonstrates a hermeneutical discipline and method that is both evangelical and accessible. Preachers will find the volume particularly helpful.

This book develops an argument in defense of expository preaching. Uncharacteristic of the rest of the book is a practical section on hermeneutics. Clear treatment is given to the benefits of exposition as well as the dangers of abandoning the method. Guidelines are provided to prevent the expositor from erroneously interpreting the text. A limited amount, but helpful attention is given to methods of delivery that are best utilized in an expositional style.

- Stein, Robert. *Playing by the Rules: A Basic Guide to Interpreting the Bible*. Grand Rapids: Baker, 1994.

Teaches at Bethel Theological Seminary, has continued his contribution to biblical hermeneutics with this work arguing that the different forms of biblical literature should be understood within the canonical context as accomplishing God's purpose.
- Thomas, Robert L. "The Relationship Between Exegesis and Expository Preaching." *Master's Seminary Journal* 2 (Fall 1991) : 181-98.

This article propagates the use of exegesis solely as a means of obtaining information from the text and exposition solely purposed to convey that information to the hearer. The overall goal of expository preaching, according to the author, is to enhance the listener's comprehension of scriptures intent. The idea is conveyed that scriptural information will produce personal transformation. Heavy weight is given to the need of the expositor to be well versed in the languages. A survey process of exegesis is suggested. Brief, but insightful attention is given to the field of hermeneutics.
